Candidate motivational statement

In the statement, please demonstrate your expertise and experience in the area of sustainable and digital trade facilitation, and specifically related to:

I have been involved with UN/CEFACT as an expert delegate since March 2023 and have a deep familiarity with the tools being adopted by UN/CEFACT such as web vocabularies and verifiable credentials, which are emerging data exchange mechanisms that will revolutionize trade and e-business. I am currently the project lead for the UN/CEFACT critical raw materials resilience and sustainability project, which has seen the largest participation of any UN/CEFACT project for the last 20 years. The project is in progress and will result in deliverables that include interoperability standards, schemas, web vocabularies, implementation guides, reports and a UNECE policy recommendation.

In my role with the Government of British Columbia (BC), Canada, I lead the Energy & Mines Digital Trust project which utilizes verifiable credentials to exchange regulatory and sustainability data about the performance of BC mining operators. My role in this multi-year project involves leading the management of a team of staff and contractors, funding & budgets, technology development, communications, change management, governance development, legal and privacy impact assessments, and stakeholder management. The project is award winning and has been internationally recognized for its innovative approach to adopting emerging technology to foster trust and transparency in government processes and sustainability reporting by industry. Some highlights include:

- Developed 5 digital credentials, with use cases in the mining and natural gas sectors.
- Onboarded 17 use case participants to the digital trust ecosystem, representing provincial, national, and global interests.
- Presented at over 20 events, many of them international, and built relationships with over 140 global stakeholders.
 - Event highlights include COP27 Global Innovation Hub and the 40th UN/CEFACT Forum in Geneva
- Winner of the BC Cleantech Award Government Champion of the Year

My motivation to join the Bureau is to help drive UN/CEFACT towards a new era of relevance and value to member states and their trading communities. Recent projects at UN/CEFACT that focus on supply chain sustainability through traceability and transparency have attracted a very high level of interest, increasing membership, and much higher participation rates. There is a compelling opportunity to refocus UN/CEFACT on contributing to UN Sustainable Development Goals by prioritising digital standards for sustainable supply chains. The level of international interest from member states and industry in this work also presents the potential of new funding vehicles for the UN/CEFACT secretariat so that the secretariat can deliver more work at an overall lower cost to the UNECE purse.
