FAO's fisheries work areas relevant to UN/CEFACT and FLUX

- 1. Supporting policy making through trends monitoring
 - ➤ Global fishery statistics and information
- 2. Responsible supply chain and trade
 - ➤ Traceability of fishery products
- 3. Combatting illegal, unreported and unregulated (IUU) fishing
 - ➤ Global Record, PSMA, RFMOs...



Combatting IUU fishing

- FAO Global Record of Fishing Vessels, Refrigerated Transport Vessels and Supply Vessels (Global Record)
 - ✓ Mainly a flag State responsibility (vessel details, history, authorizations...)
 - ✓ Transparency and traceability (vessels, activities, products)
 - ✓ Information exchange is essential!
 - ✓ Key in verification of information and supporting risk assessment
 - ✓ Publicly available since 9th July 2018 at: www.fao.org/global-record/information-system/en
 - ✓ 52 countries so far with 1/3 of the global eligible fleet





Combatting IUU fishing


- ➤ FAO Port State Measures Agreement (PSMA)
 1st legally binding agreement IUU fishing (5 June 2016)
 - ✓ Port State responsibility (port entry/use denial, port inspections)
 - ✓ Ratification → Implementation → Info Exchange (essential!)
 - ✓ Development underway of the PSMA Global Information Exchange System
 - ✓ Real-time data exchange needed for hundreds/thousands daily inpections worlwide
 - ✓ 57 Parties to date (56 + EU) http://www.fao.org/port-state-measures/en/






Combatting IUU fishing

- ➤ Other instruments such as Catch Documentation Schemes
 - √ Flag/Market State responsibility
 - ✓ Traceability of fish products
 - √ Production → processing → distribution
 - √ Future global information exchange mechanism?





- ➤ Regional Fisheries Management Organizations (RFMOs)
 - √ Key role in implementation of PSMA
 - ✓ Support Contracting Parties' participation to Global Record
 - √ Other information exchange



Concrete actions for 2019

- ✓ Continued participation/contribution to the work of the Team of Specialists on Sustainable Fisheries
- ✓ Promote use of FLUX for fisheries information exchange
- ✓ Implement FLUX-TL (transportation layer) and become a FLUX node
- ✓ Test information exchange with:
 - **✓** EU
 - **✓** NEAFC
 - ✓ GFCM?
 - ✓ State?
