
EU fisheries

EU internal context

- Common Fisheries Policy
 - EU has exclusive competence to act together
- 23 Member States' involved in fisheries
- 470 stocks and quotas to manage sustainably
- 85 000 active vessels to follow-up
- 5 million tons of fish landed annually





FLUX P1000 standards

Standard	Name	Description
P1000-1	GP	General principles - basic entities applied to all FLUX standards
P1000-2	Fishing Vessel	Information on vessel characteristics
P1000-3	Fishing Activity	Information on fishing vessel activities, including logbook, notifications, declarations, etc.
P1000-5	Sales	Information on fish after landing and till first sales. Sales note, take-over note, transport document
P1000-7	Vessel Position	VMS data
P1000-8	Inspection Report	Electronic inspection reports
P1000-9	FLAP	Fishing Licenses; Authorisations & Permits
P1000-10	MDM	Master Data Management – information on code lists
P1000-12	ACDR	Aggregated Catch Data Reporting





 - 100 000 EUR
 - Practical support
 - making and using FLUX standard

 - other tools to come






EU cooperates with its FLUX partners
