2a. Projects under Focal Points	A question was raised if Focal Points should have projects, as these are usually launched under Domains. It was suggested that internal publication projects should be able to be lead in Focal Points, but perhaps not external publication projects. It was suggested that perhaps a term of reference might be needed to define Focal Point. A question was raised as to why the "International Supply Chain Orchestration" area was created as a Focal Point? Why not just make it a Domain? The ISCO is working on their project and should have more clarity on their direction in two weeks time. So, it was suggested to review this at that time. It was reminded that the Chair decides on the distribution of domains/focal points (in consultation with the Bureau Members).	
2b. ISCO Background and Scope	The concerns raised from the last Bureau call were revisited. A new text was proposed which tries to address all these comments. A question was raised as to the term 'orchestration' which could be interpreted as how different processes work together. However, in the English language, this can be much broader. It is being suggested that we start to address APIs and new technologies such as JSON. A comment suggested that if there are new technical specifications to be developed, these would normally be under the Specification Domain.	Text put forward with minor modifications for Written Procedure Approval by Friday 3 rd August noon CET.

	However, it was reminded that just as recommendations are being done under other domains, such specifications might be developed elsewhere as well – of course, it is hoped, in collaboration with all pertinent domains and experts. Questions were raised on the new technologies such as API and W3C WebSub as this seems to be out of scope of our current Programme of Work. The PoW is currently being updated so they could be integrated. It does seem that these topics are within scope of the Strategy, point C. It was questioned if we would be developing software. This is not the intention; we would show people how to go towards software, but not develop it ourselves.	
3a. eGov – IoT Project	 Proposed Project Leader: Virginia Cram Martos Proposed Project co-Leader: Kaushik Srinivasan Proposed Supporting VC: VC Khan It was questioned why the project was not proposing a public review. For this type of project, a public review would be very valuable. It was suggested that we could add the public review after the draft development is finalized. Given the comments on the call, a Public Review stage was added. It was suggested that this work might be more adapted for a green paper. This idea was dismissed. It was also suggested that caution be taken in order to ensure that such work not create new gaps for LDCs. This is not the intention of this work. The availability of the proposed project leader was questioned as she is busy with another project; the proposing VC confirmed that he has assurance from her that she will be able to take the lead and a co-Lead is proposed to support her in this function.
