3a. SCMP – CI S.C. Track and Trace project proposal	The SCMP proposes a Cross-Industry Track and Trace. The relationship with the Agriculture work on Track and Trace needs to be considered. The latter is concentrating more regulatory aspects; the current project would complete this with the supply chain aspects of track and trace. The only challenge will be to ensure that the two approaches are correctly aligned. Question was raised if there would be an over-arching standard for all track and trace and how it would relate to all of these projects. This should be aligned to a future BSP-RDM. Request to add current work items to the list of initial contributions (Smart Container project, Buy-Ship-Pay Reference Data Model project, FLUX, Textile/Leather traceability project).	Bureau decision 1901050: The Bureau approved the CI S.C. Track and Trace project proposal with minor adjustments pending three HoD support. Project leader: Rolf Wessel. Supporting VC: Ian Watt

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	Question was raised as to how this would match with the GS1 EPCIS standard. It was noted that this work is already being integrated into the agriculture work on the topic.

There seems to be discussion in the EC that UNECE may be requested by the EU to manage this software in the future. Concern was raised by the Bureau that such a significant and controversial decision might be taken without formal discussion within the Bureau or the Plenary beforehand. Concern was also raised that a Terms of Reference or a Program of Work may be modified to accommodate this without the knowledge of the Bureau. The Secretariat assured the Bureau that no such change has been made.
