3x. Pending projects	Concerning the Message Header project, the final draft after the last public review shall be put forward on the next call for final approval and publication. A follow-up task may be needed in order to integrate any required information in the library. A question was raised concerning the CI SC Track and Trace project in order to provide further guidance on the deliverables. This will be discussed in the project team and brought back to a future Bureau call.	
4a. Forum	The secretariat explained that a meeting location has been secured for a Forum in Saint Petersburg, Russia in September or October 2020. The initial idea was to run a UNECE conference in parallel to this meeting in order to attract local participation. On the situation in Russia, the lockdown is being lifted, though there is expectation of a possible second wave of COVID-19 from November. The situation around this pandemic is unpredictable; if we would have a meeting, certain safety measures would be necessary (such as a one-and-a-half-meter distance in the meeting rooms). Each country may also have different protocols – for entry, for exit, for re-entry – which might discourage or impede some experts to travel. It was reminded that a Forum requires two to three months of preparations prior to the meeting (visa support, organizing agendas, getting all the pertinent information). A decision would need to be taken and announced within the next three weeks. In this context, it is unlikely that a physical meeting would actually be possible. It was suggested that alternative formats be studied: Partly in-person, partly on-line option (this would require very stable internet with sufficient bandwidth) Partly in-person (but then the format would need to be discussed: series of conferences, working meetings of domains/project teams over a day or two, over two or three weeks) It was pointed out that since the confinement, the virtual meetings have been working very well and the productivity level has seemed to increase. It was agreed that some sort of meeting should be organized in Q3-Q4 of 2020 for the experts.
