2a. PoW	Three different versions of the Programme of Work have been prepared. A streamlined high-level version in September, a full version with all projects based on the Strategy and a PDA-streamlined version. Concern was raised that if new work items are raised, they may not be able to start with the PDA-streamlined as the tables will be read as exhaustive lists. It was commented that the full version would have the same problem. It was suggested that perhaps the September version and the PDA-streamlined version could be combined. Other voices preferred the full version based on the Strategy. The path forward was not clear as all versions are essentially the same information presented slightly differently. It was reminded that the Director has requested to review the PoW before finalization. It was suggested that perhaps both versions be presented to the Director for her opinion.	The Secretariat was requested to prepare a clean version of both an original set with everything and a consolidation of the September version with the PDA-based tables.

3b. + 3c AGRI Textile project	The AGRI textile project has proposed two eBusiness standards (BRS) with a request to go to Public Review. Since the documents were submitted, there were requests to modify the wording of the documents. Reference Data Model is a term which is reserved for a very high-level view of the BSP architecture (based on a domain – not a single standard); business standards would be based on this reference data model approach.
