

THE EGYPTIAN COTTON Premium quality and strategic for the country

- Textile industry strategic sector in the Egyptian economy: second largest sector (after agriculture), representing 25% of industrial production, 20% of the country's workforce (about 1.5 mln) in activities related to textiles, half women.
- *Vertically integrated* cotton-textile industry, from raw material to finished product.
- Among Egypt's strongest comparative advantage is its GMO free high-quality cotton production.
- Egyptian Raw Cotton Exports see 218.8% increase during Q3 2018/2019 compared corresponding period of the previous season

A five-year CSR initiative based on strategic partnerships with cotton growers and governmental entities to support Egyptian organic and sustainable cotton launched in 2015 by Filmar SpA and ALEXBANK of the Intesa San Paolo Group.





In 2017, given the importance of advancing sustainability of Egyptian cotton industry, UNIDO, the Egyptian Ministry of Trade and Industry and the Ministry of Agriculture with funding by the Italian government launched The Egyptian Cotton Project

Promoting Sustainable Egyptian Cotton

The UNIDO cotton project activated pilot cultivations aligned with the BCI and organic systems through a multistakeholder program jointly coordinated with relevant governmental entities, farmers' cooperatives, cotton-textile associations, local and international cotton manufacturers, international brands and retailers

- Estimated production is approx. 700,000 kg of lint and 500,000 kg of combed yarn




