





Doc 01 Policy Recommendation Part I

- **1. Target audience** Which ones? Public-sector/policy makers (Governments) and private-sector decision makers (companies)?
- 2. **"Prevent environmental impacts"** highlight support to general risk management
- **3.** "Black Mirror" test suggest a risk-analysis of possible unintended consequences of "too much traceability and transparency"
- **4. Risk Map** need to identify what the problems are and which areas they affect. A thorough risk management would allow us to work better and save time, effort, and money.




