<b>Recommendation structure</b>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. Make the "Terms and Definition" section as a Glossary.</li><li>2. Leave "Executive summary" section empty. UNECE Secretariat will fill it. The content of the current "Executive summary" can be re-placed e.g. to 'Scope' or 'Benefits' or within the Guidelines.</li></ol>
<b>Use of terms and definitions</b>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>3. Analyze if there is any terms in "Terms and Definition" section that are not used in the text.</li><li>4. Analyze if terms definitions given in other UN/CEFACT recommendations can be fully reused here.</li><li>5. Analyze if there are any terms definitions that contradict terms definitions in other UN/CEFACT recommendations and make the corresponding corrections or specializing by confining their scope of validity to the Recommendation.</li></ol>
<b>Recommendation applicability and its place in UN/CEFACT trade documents standards package</b>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>6. Update the "Scope" section with the cases and conditions when the Recommendation can be implemented. Add a few real life examples to the Guidelines (e.g. providing trade facilitation in e-tendering, and On-line Dispute Resolution scenarios). Reformulate the recommended</li></ol>

	<p>practice to correspond to the same structure as other recent UN/CEFACT recommendations (see Rec 40 or Rec 4) – be sure to repeat here the condition of when this recommended practice would apply.</p>

Update the "Recommendation" section in the 1st part of the document with a clear description of the balance between the technological neutrality and practical applicability for high-level management.</li> <li>8. Write the Table 1 content in a more abstract form.</li> <li>9. Consider providing some examples of the technologies which would comply with the recommended practice (perhaps in annex).</li> </ol>
