Theme: Governance

This sub group focuses on the mechanism required for the interconnectivity of two or more Single Window facilities. It will concentrate on the Governance Issues related to the effective implementation of Single Window Interoperability. It will aim at answering the following question:

WHAT administrative, governance, and managerial conditions need to be in place in order to support single window interoperability including the conceptual and business environment?

This sub-group will explore the managerial and administrative requirements and models both for the design and development of Single Window interoperability as well as the implementation and ongoing sustainability. It should further address technical implications of interoperability from a governance perspective.

Additional Notes of Call

- We agreed that the scope of SW would remain in line with Rec 36 discussions to date. The focus for recommendations will be on SW that involve regulatory functions but lessons may be drawn from SW that do not perform regulatory functions.
- We agreed that we would keep discussion of interoperability in line with the Business Needs discussion and focus on lessons and recommendations for cross border interoperability but recognise that lessons may be drawn on governance models from SW that are interoperable within national boundaries.
- As regards a general target for the scale of the paper it was agreed an initial 30 page max target would be appropriate although this may be reviewed again once the detailed outline is complete.
