Summary of the 14/10/2014 Conference Call

During the conference call it was announced that the second business case about a PPP in TF is already finished by the Italian Delegation and it will be shared by all the experts in November.

We agree that the Recommendation should talk specifically about how to implement PPP in the following main areas: infrastructures, technologies, and services. These three main topics will be developed as follows:

- a) Infrastructures: PPP in Ports, PPP in Airports
- b) Technologies: PPP in Corridors, PPP in Single Windows and PPP in International Trade Web Site Portals
- c) Services: PPP in Licencing and PPP in Coordinated Border Management.

Some experts agreed to develop the following contents:

- a) Infrastructures: PPP in Ports, PPP in Airports (Guillaume LAURENCY)
- b) Technologies: PPP in Corridors (Paloma BERNAL), PPP in Single Windows (Paloma BERNAL),
- c) Services: PPP in Licencing and PPP in Coordinated Border Management (Maurice DIAMOND) .

Also Bill LUDDY point out that border services could be provided by customs management: technology,... and he collaborate to develop this idea in the topic of Main types of PPP projects and legal standards of UNCITRAL.

During the conference call we review the text to harmonize the contents and have more accurate expository writing.
