RECENT DEVELOPMENTS

UN/CEFACT Plenary & Chair Elections

The UN/CEFACT Plenary is planned for 30 April and 1 May in Geneva. The agenda is available at <u>the</u> <u>dedicated webpage</u> and the rest of the documents are progressively being added. You are reminded that one of the first agenda items will be the election for UN/CEFACT Chair. The deadline for candidatures received from the Mission to the UN in Geneva is 15 March; more information on the procedure is available in the <u>UN/CEFACT mandate and terms of reference</u>, paragraphs 52-73, or you can contact the <u>UNECE secretariat</u>.

Also during the Plenary, we will be presenting a number of deliverables that should be of interest to you, including reports from several recent meetings such as the UN/LOCODE Advisory Group, the Team of Specialists on Sustainable Fisheries and the 4th International conference on Single Window. UN/CEFACT has been working hard on aligning its work to support process-driven exchanges in support of Data Pipeline, Blockchain, Traceability and other recent evolutions. Several Executive Guides are also made available to help the understanding of our technical deliverables.

We look forward to seeing you in Geneva for the Plenary and hopefully also the preceding UN/CEFACT Forum. Reminder that each member of your delegation to the Plenary must be pre-approved by the HoD or – if there is no HoD – the Mission in Geneva.

UN/CEFACT Forum in Geneva

The UN/CEFACT Forum is planned from 23-27 April in Geneva. Recently completed projects

The Transport and Logistics Domain has just completed the eCMR project. This standard eCMR message supports the Additional Protocol to the UNECE CMR Convention and provides a clear model for electronic version of the eCMR. More information available on <u>the deliverable webpage</u>.

Recently approved projects

The Single Window Domain is pleased to announce the launch of the <u>revision of Recommendation 33</u> <u>on Single Window Implementation</u>. This cornerstone recommendation is referenced in various other standards organizations and national implementations; this revision project aims to update the content, remove dated examples without disrupting the use of the recommendation. The Transport and Logistics Domain (T+L) is pleased to announce the launch of the <u>revision of</u> <u>Recommendation 16 on UN Location Codes for Trade, Transport and Administrations (UN/LOCODE)</u>. This essential coding system is widely used in transport and administrations around the world. Following the creation of the UN/LOCODE Advisory Group at the 23rd Plenary, the experts agreed that it was time to update some of the aspects of this guidance. The T+L has launched the <u>Buy-Ship-Pay Reference Data Model project</u>. This project aims to create a subset of the Core Component Library which covers both the SCRDM and the MMT-RDM, in order to ensure continued harmonization between these. The T+L has also launched a project on IMO FAL messages. Currently, IMO plans to publish the suggested messages from UN/CEFACT, WCO and ISO. This project is to officially map and create these messages.
